 The Chamber currently has money lent out to 8 local entrepreneurs through the Small Business Loans Program to help fund their business ventures.

This is a high level overview of some of the workings of the Chamber in 2009. I don't think one really understands how much the Chamber does until you take a term on the board. I strongly encourage everyone to try to get involved with the Chamber at some point; it is a great learning experience and provides insight into how much is being done in this community.

My term as president was a trial run of a two year term. Considering that people serve in a volunteer capacity on the Chamber board and it takes a considerable amount of one's time, the board has decided to go back to a one year term as president, to ensure that we do not discourage people from getting involved. With only a portion of the board turning over on an annual basis, we feel there is enough continuity to keep things rolling from year to year. The term of a director remains to be two years, but by reducing the Executive positions to one year, it allows those wanting to step up into Executive positions to get there sooner, and it is a more realistic commitment of their time.

I want to take the time to thank Juanita and Sherry for all their hard work and for putting up with me! These two ladies keep things running smoothly and do a very good job of trying to keep all the board members in line! I also want to thank all the directors that have served on the board over the last couple of years; it has been a pleasure working with you! The work of the Chamber is never done, so I wish the incoming board and soon to be elected incoming president, Lawrence Wegner, all the best in the coming year!

U of R President Visits Yorkton

SaskTel and the Future of Telecommunications Technology

Did you know that sometime in the near future you could avoid parking tickets because you'll be able to fill an empty meter from your cell? This is already happening in Vancouver. Did you know that in August, over 180 million text messages were sent over the SaskTel network? That's 5.8 million texts sent/day. That works out to 6 messages/person/day in Saskatchewan.

Mary Ference, a SaskTel Account Executive, recently visited Yorkton to share with business the latest advances in telecommunications technology. Her message was that businesses can grow by using and adopting these new technologies. Some interesting points that she made:

- The cool new reality is that cell phones are being used not only to top up parking meters but also to pay bills. Will wallets become obsolete?
- Google has 463 million searches per day; ٠ YouTube averages over a billion.
- Social networking sites, such as facebook, twitter and yammer, now rank 4th in overall online activity. To remain competitive, businesses need to create a presence on these sites.
- "Smartphones" are cell phones that can email, text, be a calendar, take photos and browse the internet.
- By 2011, all Saskatchewan residents will have access to high speed internet.
- And an interesting suggestion she made to employers with Generation Y employees was that in order to keep these employees engaged, they need to be provided with the newest technology, not the cast-offs from senior staff. Gen Y is often characterized as being "connected" since they are the first generation raised with computers, internet and cell phones. Generation Y wants to learn, use technology for flexibility, instant communications and to be part of a team. They don't need to know everything, just where to find it.

Last month, University of Regina President

Vianne Timmons visited Yorkton in an effort to strengthen the ties between this community and the University. At a reception held for the Alumni and the business community, she shared some interesting facts:

- Over 12,000 students are presently enrolled in the University's programs
- 10% of the student body is comprised of foreign students
- \$7 million in wages were paid this past year to students enrolled in the co-op program
- The University is on Face Book in order to better communicate with its students
- The University is committed to connecting with the students from the time they arrive on campus until they leave. This means the students will have access to services and programs that will help them to study and socialize
- The University has recently announced a guarantee to each student that within 6 months of graduation, a student will find a job in his/her field. If the student is not successfully employed in that time, the University will provide the student with a bursary for up to one additional year's tuition
- Over the last 5 years, over 150 students from Yorkton have graduated from the
