
# Chamber Business Dinner

# Interesting Facts on Saskatchewan

- The Holy Trinity Anglican Church at Stanley Mission, Saskatchewan is the oldest Church in Western Canada.
- The first bird sanctuary in North America was established in 1887 at Last Mountain Lake in Saskatchewan and now forms the Last Mountain Lake National Wildlife area.
- Longest Pedestrian Bridge—The Skytrail Bridge in Outlook is the longest pedestrian bridge in Canada. It is part of the Trans Canada Trail. The bridge spans over 914 metres (3,000 feet) and is over 45 metres (over 150 feet) above the South Saskatchewan River, providing a spectacular view.
- The Big Muddy (near Big Beaver) in south-central Saskatchewan was the only Canadian stop on the Outlaw Trail. The Outlaw Trail (which ran from Canada to Mexico) was used by Butch Cassidy and his gang, and by cattle and horse thieves. The Big Muddy Badlands had deep coulees and caves which were places for the outlaws to hideout.
- Prince Albert is the only constituency in Canada that has been represented by three Prime Ministers-William Lyon Mackenzie King, John Diefenbaker and Sir Wilfred Laurier.

- The first Ukrainian Governor of Canada was Ray Hnatyshyn. He was born and raised in Saskatoon.
- The first female Governor General of Canada was Jeanne Sauve. She was from Prud'homme.
- Did you know that a goat from Broadview Saskatchewan served overseas in World War 1 and has the medals to prove it? A girl from Broadview presented her pet goat to the 5th Canadian Infantry Battalion as a mascot in1914. "Sargeant Bill" became a favorite among men. Bill went into the trenches near Armentiers, was gassed during the Second Battle of Ypres, was wounded by shrapnel at Festhubert, and suffered from trench feet. Sgt. Bill survived World War 1 and returned to Saskatchewan. When he died, Bill was stuffed, mounted, and placed in the Saskatchewan Legislative Building. Eventually he was returned to Broadview where he now has a place of honor in the Broadview Museum.

# Air Travel Survey Results Shows Need for Air Service

A couple of months ago, on behalf of the Yorkton Airport Authority, Chamber members were invited to participate in a survey regarding potential passenger air service to and from Yorkton. While this is not a statistically sound survey, it does provide the YAA with an indication of the business community's thoughts about air travel. The following are some of the highlights from that survey:

- · Winnipeg and Swan River are the 2 destinations that Yorkton businesses visit most often. These were followed by Edmonton, Calgary, Saskatoon and Regina.
- The maximum cost for one-way, that would justify using air travel was \$250 to Winnipeg, Swan River, Regina, Saskatoon and Edmonton. A one-way ticket costing between \$250 and \$500 would also justify air travel to Edmonton and to Calgary.



- · 85% of the respondents indicated that if the cost of air travel was within their maximum limit, they would scheduled air service from Yorkton.
- 59% indicated that daily, week day use would be of value.
- 45% indicated that service at least3 days a week is important.
