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## Just a Reminder: Chip Liability Shift

Due to card network regulation changes, merchants will become liable for all losses resulting from fraudulent Visa and MasterCard chip credit card transactions that are processed through a non-chip terminal.

## Effective dates for liability shift are

- Visa - March 31, 2011
- MasterCard - March 31, 2011
- Other card types are not impacted at this time.

Merchant's account will be debited for the loss, via a chargeback - regardless of whether they have a sales draft for proof of the sale.
As a result of this liability shift, errors involving the improper processing of MasterCard and Visa cards by untrained staff can result in increased costs.
