- Yorkton SARCAN will handle over 8,000,000 beverage containers in one year!
- The life expectancy of the current land fill is 6 - 8 years.
- The estimated cost of the first phase of a new landfill is between \$6 - \$8 million. This includes the cost of a retention pond for runoff, liners, roadways, drainage tiles and fencing. The new land fill is expected to last for 20 years.

Recycling Important to Yorkton

Just a reminder to businesses that the recycling bins set out in the community are for residential use only. Businesses must make their own arrangements for recycling.

Recently, the Chamber was told that the new system of residential recycling was not being utilized as well as the old system. So we spoke to Stefan Bymak, Program Director Prairie Harvest Employment Program (PHEP). Stefan informed us that the new system is actually going over quite well:

"At the beginning of the switch to the clear bag system there were fewer people recycling. This occurred most likely because they hadn't purchased bags or were not certain about the new process. From the start of 2011, the volume of material that we are delivering to the Kinsmen Recycling Center is approximately the same as the overall averages from 2010. On any given day it might appear that there are fewer people recycling. This is due to the increased amount of material that people can now leave on the curb. Previously residents would set their bin out weekly or bi-weekly. Now most residents are able to set out their recycling materials every 2 or 3 weeks. So although there may be less people setting out material on any given day, the overall volume of material collected is the same. We have had a number of individuals giving us positive feedback concerning the change. We are aware that the program

continues to grow, as each week new families choose to participate. The new program has also enabled our workers to complete the routes sooner in the day. As we had hoped, this gives us the opportunity to vigorously promote recycling so that every home in Yorkton is using the community's recycling services. The best estimates that I can provide regarding volumes of material collected are as follows:

- 2009- 4.8t/week
- 2010- 5.6t/week
- 2011- 5.5t/week
