

# Involvement in the Community as a Chamber Director a Great Experience

The persistence of a friend convinced Brent Murdock to let his name stand for election to the Board of the Yorkton Chamber of Commerce. Now into the second year of his first term, Brent is enjoying the experience.

Brent moved from Ontario to Yorkton with his wife, Loretta in 2008. When first approached to run for a Directorship that year, he felt he was too new to the community and didn't really understand what the Chamber was all about. Chamber Director Ron Evinou persisted and in 2009, convinced Brent that this would be a good idea. When Brent's employer supported his candidacy, he decided to "give it a try".

Involvement in Yorkton's Chamber of Commerce appealed to Brent because it was not likely he could be involved in a Chamber in any of Ontario's large cities. "There are few opportunities for a regular working guy like me to become involved in a Chamber back home. And this was a chance to jump in feet first and get involved in the community," he said.

Serving as a Director has been a great experience. "I got to meet with local politicians and become familiar with them - that is not something you would be able to do in a bigger centre".

One of the most memorable experiences he has had representing the Chamber came at the 2010 Painted Hand Casino Pow Wow. "To be part of the Grand March and to feel the power and charge in the air of the dancers and drummers that was really amazing!" Receiving the lovely star blanket after bringing greetings from the Chamber was also a highlight.

Brent served on the Public Policy committee in 2010 and is on the Business Development committee in 2011. He has also served on a

Brent believes the biggest challenge for the city of Yorkton will be its ability to accept and embrace change especially regarding the development of the airport.


"The airport is crucial to the advancement and growth of Yorkton. Things will change with the arrival of the airport."
