Director Pleased to Represent the Business Community

When the call for nominations to the Board of the Yorkton Chamber of Commerce went out in October 2011, Carol Yaholnitsky thought it was time to give back to the business community so she let her name stand. Now as an elected member of the Board, Carol is enjoying playing a more active role in the business community and appreciates the networking opportunities it provides. "The Chamber is very active and I am excited to be a part of the organization," she said. "I look forward to the challenges of serving as a Board member and in contributing to the work of the Chamber".

Carol is not a stranger to the work of a Chamber. Years ago, she served as the volunteer secretary of Canora's Chamber of Commerce. Eventually, that Chamber disbanded as the volunteers had businesses to run and families to raise. "Yorkton is fortunate to have a Chamber with paid staff to keep it running smoothly", she said. "It's a sign of a prosperous community."

While Carol and her husband, Michael own Miccar Aerial Service and Good Spirit Air Service operating from the Yorkton Airport, their roots are in Canora. Carol was an Insurance Broker in the town and Michael farmed. After Michael received his pilot's licence, he began to fly for Yorkton Flying Services as a crop sprayer. Eventually, they formed their own aerial spray business but the home base remained in Canora, even though they operated from Yorkton May to October. As their business grew, the need for bigger facilities also grew so they moved the home base to Yorkton in 2005.

Recognizing the opportunity to diversify, Carol and Michael established their charter service, Good Spirit Air Service, in 2006. Currently, they own 4 King Airs that each sit 8 people. They also own 3 spray planes. Their 23 employees include their sons, Devan and Ian. Devan flies for the air charter

service as well as flying the spray planes. Ian is involved in the spray business operation and oversees the farm operation.

Good Spirit Air Service runs a weekly charter from Yorkton and Flin Flon to the uranium mines at Key Lake, Cigar Lake, Collins Lake and McArthur River. One of the benefits of having their business in the Terminal at the Yorkton Airport is the opportunity to meet so many people from all over North America. "We enjoy meeting the flight crews and passengers that arrive in Yorkton", said Carol. "One of things visitors often comment about is how friendly the people of Yorkton are."

Into the first year of her 2 year term as a Director of the Chamber, Carol thinks the 2012 Board is working on achieving its goals. "As a group, there is strength in numbers in deciding what the Chamber can do better or how it can help its member businesses."

Whatever challenges or opportunities for the Chamber arise in the future, Carol is confident the Chamber will meet them and handle them successfully.

Did You Know?

- The name of the new subdivision to the east of the Chamber/Tourism building is the Roundhouse Commercial. The name pays homage to the Yshaped spur line which was used by the CPR in 1910 to turn trains around to either head east or west from Yorkton. The shed in which the locomotives were housed for cleaning and repairs was referred to as the "roundhouse".
- · That the Yorkton Hotel is 100 years old?
- That small businesses can now apply for loans up to \$20,000 through the Chamber's Small Business Loan Association (SBLA). The funds are supplied by the Government of Saskatchewan. The loans program is designed to provide loans to small businesses that may have difficulty obtaining loans from traditional lending sources.
