Yorkton Regional Airport - An Invaluable Asset

"When you have a mile of highway, you can travel one mile. When you have a mile of railroad, you can travel one mile. When you have a mile of runway, you have the whole world. - Anon

Yorkton Regional Airport is fortunate in that it has not one, but two runways! Imagine the possibilities!

Operational year round, the Airport boasts 5 businesses with 50 - 63 employees (depending on the season). According to the Yorkton publication city's Regional Airport Profile, over the next 25 years, the Airport is expected to grow into a freight transfer point



communities northern Saskatchewan and western Manitoba. The number of air movements per year has been gradually climbing from 10,129 in 2007 to 13,263 in 2013 (Source: Statistics Canada Annual Movement Data).

As Yorkton is located within the Ports to Plains Corridor, the Airport links it to major transportation networks throughout Western Canada and the United States.

Between 2008 & 2013, the City of Yorkton and funding from the province's Community

Airport Program have contributed more than \$2.5 million towards upgrades of the runway and lighting and other projects.

Meeting with CP Rail

Directors Rob Bear and Krissy Morrison and Business Development Committee Chair Corey Werner, viewing the demonstration of an app that Mike LoVecchio, Director of Government Affairs for Canadian Pacific can use to track rail cars. As each car has a unique number, the app indicates the location of the car and its contents. This is especially useful for community First Responders in the event of an accident. Mr. LoVecchio met with the Chamber recently to



discuss a number of items including the length of trains, the use of drop down arms at crossings, overpasses, transport of dangerous goods and emergencies. Some interesting facts shared by Mr. LoVecchio: Yorkton, like so many prairie communities, grew up around the train tracks. Trains moving through Yorkton can have as many as 172 cars. Between 6 and 8 CP trains move through Yorkton in a 24 hour period.
