The Year that Was - 2015 in Review

When the 2015 Board of Directors looks back on the year, the Directors will describe it as productive. In May, the Board engaged in Strategic Planning. As a result, the Board identified 2 strategic areas in which to direct its efforts -Advocacy and Membership.

Much of the work of the Board is undertaken by its committees. committees then make recommendations to the Board and then the entire Board either accepts the recommendations or asks for more information. Some of the highlights of the Board's work in 2015 are:

Business Development:

- Discussed the City's Development Levies and researched the impact of levies on business in Yorkton. This was discussed with the Mayor and Council at a meeting.
- Conducted a Member Survey re the Enterprise Zone Incentive Program (EZIP). 100% of the respondents indicated the program should be reinstated; and 80% indicated it should extend to the city. A letter was sent to the City's Ec Dev committee recommending these responses. A letter was also sent recommending the renewal of the Rental Housing Incentive Program (RHIP).
- Met with Samuel Twumasi, EdO to discuss business opportunities in the City.
- Met with the Yorkton Housing Committee to learn more about the city' housing strategy and initiatives.
- Met with Staff Sgt Greg Nichol and Sgt Rob Nicholas to discuss policing in Yorkton.
