### You're Being Robbed!





RCMP Constables Alison Morris and Trevor Pieterse were the Guest Speakers at a recent Chamber Business Lunch about robbery - what to do in a situation and how to prevent a robbery. Cst Morris indicated that as a robbery is occurring, it's important to remain calm. Explain to the robber each action you are undertaking. Do not resist.

Cst Pieterse asked 2 students to stage a "robbery" at the Lunch and then by asking questions of the audience, demonstrated how people notice different things. Once a robbery has occurred, it's very important that the area not be contaminated so lock the doors of the business until the police can inspect the area. It's also important for witnesses not to talk to one another about what they saw or heard. A witness should write down what he/she saw before talking to anyone else.

## What are Students Saying About Employers?

During the second semester of the 2014-15 school year, YRHS Grade 12 student Kirsten MacDonald worked at the Chamber office every day through the Work Experience 12 class. Kirsten was assigned a number of duties from tidying the store room to addressing envelopes to researching the Chamber's history. Her biggest assignment was to interview fellow students about their employment.

Kirsten randomly interviewed 42 Grade 11 & 12students - 24 girls and 18 boys. Of those, 33 indicated they have jobs. When asked how many hours per week they worked, the answers ranged from 2 to 50 hours with 61% of the respondents working between 8 and 20 hours per week. When asked if their employer gave them time off for extra-curricular activities (such as sporting events, drama, arts); family time; exam schedule, 91% responded yes. Eighty five percent indicated that they felt they had sufficient training prior to beginning their job; and 91%

indicated their employer provides enough help and direction for the students while on shift. As to their pay, 40% indicated they received minimum wage when they first began working at their current job while 60% indicated they received above the minimum wage.

The question with perhaps the most interesting answer was the one asking what their employer does to make them feel like a valued employee. 40% indicated the employer was nice, created a good environment; made them feel comfortable; and was positive. 24% indicated the employer either provided free food and drinks or discounts. Other comments included "treats us like family"; "asks how I am doing"; "offers help when I need it".

While the survey won't stand up to scientific scrutiny, it is interesting to learn what this small sample of YRHS students think about their current jobs and their employers.
