Chamber The Yorkton Commerce has long billed itself as the "voice of business in Yorkton". It has the privilege of doing so because of the voluntary memberships businesses pay each year. The Chamber has worked with the City in helping to inform the community about the study "Transportation and Growth Opportunities for the Yorkton Region".

To the Provincial Government, the Chamber has indicated its disappointment in the termination of the Small Business Loan Association (SBLA) program. The Chamber has also indicated to the Government the need for the

province to provide adequate funding to the Sunrise Health Region to meet its staffing and medical facilities needs.
