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
The VOICE of Business



State of the City in 2015

At a recent Chamber Business Lunch, Mayor Maloney discussed the city's achievements in 2014 and its plans for 2015 and into the future. In addition to his visual presentation, Mayor Maloney distributed the document "Where Do My 2015 Tax Dollars Go?" The graph depicts the percentage each sector takes from a loonie. For instance, Public Works takes 17.0¢ to look after streets, street lighting, snow removal, etc. Servicing the debt on the Gallagher Centre and the Fire Hall takes another 6.9¢ from every loonie. City Officials Discuss Building Services



Brant Hryhorczuk, Building Services Manager urges people to speak to his department before undertaking any building or renovation projects. At a recent Chamber Business Breakfast, Brant Hryhorczuk, Building Services Manager; Michael Eger, City Planner; and Fire Chief Trevor Morrissey talked about the importance of the Building code and permit requirements; the Zoning Bylaw; and fire protection. Brant said, "The Building Services Department is pro development. "We love businesses to thrive but at the same time we have a duty of care to ensure that buildings meet public safety requirements." Brant recommended that people talk to the Department prior to undertaking any construction or renovation projects to learn if a building permit is required. Michael indicated that when the new Zoning Bylaw is complete, it will standardize setbacks for

dwellings, decks and garages with Building current Code requirements. "It will also contain more definitions in an effort to provide greater clarity which will assist the staff in their interpretation of the Bylaw", he said. Chief Morrissey indicated the Fire Department works closely with the Building Services Department to ensure the National Fire Code is implemented. He mentioned that the staff are beginning to work with businesses to develop Pre Plans - which include either sketches of the building or the blueprints, the number of people employed and a list of any hazardous goods or materials present so the Fire Department has them on file in the event of an emergency.



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2015 Chamber Priorities

The 2015 Board of Directors met in mid January for its annual Planning Session. Guided through the exercise by former Director, Tom Seeley, the group established its priorities and goals for 2015.

Some of the Priorities from 2014 carried over to 2015 include:

• Monitor the Labour Market

- How will the changes to the Temporary Foreign Worker Program affect our members?
- What impact will the Sask Immigrant Nominee Program have on the work force?
- Housing Availability
 - Monitor the housing needs of employees.
 - The Board will review the updated Housing Needs Assessment when it is completed later this year.
- Yorkton Regional Airport
 - Offer to work with the Yorkton Airport Authority to enhance the growth of the Airport.
- Monitor City of Yorkton Bylaws and Policies
 - As the "voice of business in Yorkton", it is essential that the Chamber monitor bylaws and policies that impact the business community.
- Meet with City Council, MLA and MP
 - Meetings with these representatives have proven to be valuable in the past. The Chamber will strive to ensure Yorkton's "business voice" is heard by all orders of government.

Some of the New Priorities for 2015 include:

- Letters will be sent to CN and CP asking for clarification about railway policies as trains travel through the city.
- Implications to Businesses during the renewal of the Infrastructure along Broadway
 - Work with YBID to ensure this is as painless as possible for the businesses most affected while the work is being undertaken.

These priorities have now been referred to their respective committees. Each Director serves on at least one of the Chamber's four standing committees -Business Development; Events; Marketing & Communications; and Policy.

The Board encourages Chamber members to contact the Board if they encounter an issue with which they feel the Chamber may be able to assist. In such instances, contact should be made first with Juanita Polegi, Executive Director, followed by an email or letter.
