





- Membership continues upward! As of Oct 14, the Chamber has 477 members!
- At the October 17 meeting of City Council, the Chamber learned that some of the areas in which the Chamber has suggested the City move forward on are beginning to see some action. The Enterprise Zone Incentive Program (EZIP) is being reviewed by the Ec Dev Commission which will bring recommendations to Council in early 2017. A draft Airport Development Plan has been prepared and is
- being discussed with the YAA and airport tenants. Consideration is being given to changing the name of York Colony and to modifying the subdivision.
- The Chamber has indicated its support for a Private Members Bill C - 274. The Bill will call upon the Federal Government to revise its taxation laws to make them more fair with regards to the sale of a small business, family farm or fishing operation to a family member.
