# The VOICE of Business

### **Town Hall Meeting Draws Crowd**

Over 100 business people attended the Town Hall Meeting held June 28 to discuss the hikes in the 2017 Commercial Property Tax bills. The meeting's purpose was to enable the business owners to learn more about how the tax bill was developed and what constituted the difference between the 2017 tax bill and that of 2016.

The Honourable Greg Ottenbreit. MLA Yorkton spoke about the many decisions the Government of Saskatchewan had to make in order to address the \$1 billion dollar deficit. Its plan is to bring the budget back into balance within the next 3 years. Mr. Ottenbreit indicated that planning for the 2018-19 budget is already occurring. Additionally, the Ministry of Government Relations is consulting with municipalities (SUMA and SARM) on how to deliver future funding (Revenue Sharing and former Grants in Lieu). He indicated he is aware that tax hikes have an impact on business and he encouraged business owners to use the Assessment Appeals process. He also acknowledged that the removal of the Grants-In-Lieu to the cities created huge difficulties for the cities - especially Yorkton. As a result, the cap on the loss of the GIL was set at 30%

Kevin Groat, Assistant Managing Director, Assessment Services with the Sask Assessment Management Agency (SAMA), explained that January 1, 2015 is the Base Date on which the current assessment is based. The value of property between that time and today may have changed. The video he showed explaining property assessment,

entitled How Properties are Assessed, is available on SAMA's website and the City's website (www.yorkton.ca). Mr. Groat indicated that due to a computer upgrade, SAMA released its data to the City later than anticipated and recognizes this created some difficulties for the city. He stated businesses can begin to launch an appeal to their assessments when the City announces that the Assessment Roll is open. In a revaluation year the appeal period is 60 days. All other years, the period is 30 days. Appeals are not retroactive.

The power point presentation used by Lonnie Kaal, City Manager is also available on the City's website www.yorkton.ca/news/. She showed the City's revenue sources and explained that a decrease in one revenue source means an increase in other sources, namely property taxes. The 2017 loss of crown payments in lieu was significant and equates to 58% of provincial grants. While the reprieve in capping the loss to 30% in 2017 was appreciated, the concern is that the rest will be lost in 2018 which equates to another almost 4% tax increase. She

also indicated that while on average, the increase in the Education Tax legislated by the Government of Saskatchewan is 9.8%, in Yorkton, it is even higher because our assessments increased greater than the provincial average! The delay in receiving the assessment information also put the city in a difficult position because it was not given enough time to even consider a phase-in approach to the shift in taxes that the new assessments created.

The Q & A session following the presentations was a lively one with a number of businesses expressing their frustration at the impact the tax hike is having on their businesses. While many were expecting increases, no one was budgeting for 60 or 100 or 240% increases! One business reported an increase on land value alone of 1365%!

The Chamber was pleased to be able to host the Town Hall meeting which helped the Chamber to fulfill its mandate of advocating for business. Thank you to all the speakers.
