# The VOICE of Business

### **Proposed Federal** Tax Changes Distressing

Described as the biggest changes to the tax system in over 50 years, the proposed federal tax changes have the business community across the country concerned. Below are excerpts from an article that describe why these proposed changes are so alarming prepared by Hendrik Brakel, Senior Director, Economic, Financial and Tax Policy for the Canadian Chamber of Commerce:

We are particularly worried about the impact on business from (1) a new tax on investment income in a corporation and (2) tough new rules for compensation in family businesses. Why is the government doing this?

The Minister says it's all about "fairness" and his consultation document compares the tax treatment of a business owner with that of an employee to point out corporations have "unfair" advantages. But the comparison makes no sense. Unlike an employee, a business owner doesn't get a pension or health benefits or vacation pay. She invested her own money to get the business started. She has employees who depend on her. And if nobody wants her goods or services next month, she does not earn a penny.

That's why in every advanced economy in the world, businesses

can accumulate and invest aftertax retained earnings so they have money to get them through an economic downturn or to make big capital investments.

The government wants to tax "passive" (invested income). It says it's a crackdown on "high income individuals", but the rules would apply to all incorporated businesses in Canada, most of whom are restaurants, retailers, farmers and consultants - to punish them for saving and investing. It gets worse!

Finance Canada also expects to raise \$250 million by cracking down on "unreasonable" salaries paid to family members, which it says diverts corporate income into lower tax brackets. But to pull in \$250 million, CRA will have to tax over \$1 billion in salaries and audit hundreds of thousands of businesses. Imagine the litigation!

Incredibly, Finance Canada has managed to design a set of tax measures that would hit the maximum number of businesses in the most complicated way for a small amount of revenue. The expected \$250 million is less than 1% of the federal deficit.

Nobody supports tax evasion or loopholes. But these changes will punish legitimate businesses. And they come after the government cancelled reductions in the small

business tax rate, tightened rules on partnerships and started taxing work in progress. That's on top of new carbon taxes, raised CPP premiums and an increase in the EI rate. Our members are asking why this government keeps raising taxes on business.

The Yorkton Chamber has strived to inform its members about these changes and has urged businesses to send their concerns to the Minister of Finance, the Hon. Bill Morneau and to send copies to Hon. Ralph Goodale, the only Liberal MP in Saskatchewan; and to Cathay Wagantall, MP Yorkton-Melville.

The Chamber itself has hosted a Lunch about this topic, has met with Mrs.

Wagantall, sent a letter to Mr. Morneau and offered to co-sign a resolution submitted by the Kamloops Chamber at the Canadian Chamber's AGM. In the letter from the Yorkton Chamber to Mr. Morneau, the Board urged him to 1) halt the legislation; and 2) Engage with businesses and business organizations in a meaningful consultation that extends far beyond October 2.

If you haven't already sent your letter to the Minister of Finance, please don't wait to do so. At a recent Chamber Business Lunch, Sarah Tkachuk, lead tax partner at KPMG provided an overview of the proposed federal tax changes and explained how these will impact small business. Incorporated businesses could be facing a larger tax bill and big compliance cost if these changes are implemented. Chambers across the country have been expressing their concern about these proposals and urging businesses to share the impact with their MPs.

George Gallagher began working at the CJGX radio station in 1947; became a partner in the ownership in 1956: and became the sole owner of the station in 1989. An entrepreneur, Dick DeRyk co-founded Yorkton This Week in 1975 and served as its Editor until 1987. For the next 20 years, Dick owned and operated several business in Yorkton. He continues to own and manage Uncommon Sense Solutions. He has served as a City Councillor for a total of 13 years. He has contributed to a variety of local and provincial organizations. As a Director of the Yorkton Chamber in 985, Dick organized the establishment of Tourism Yorkton and was its first president. He was the founding chair of the Godfrey Dean Art Gallery and is currently a Board member of SIGN. He was the first chair of the Board of Tourism Saskatchewan; first President of the Sask Golf Association; and is currently the Vice-Chair of Access Communications Co-operative. In his acceptance remarks, Dick offered this advice for young entrepreneurs: "When it stops being fun, go do something else. Nothing is worth sacrificing your happiness and enjoyment -including money and recognition!"
