The VOICE of Business

Saskatchewan and the Carbon Tax

The Yorkton Chamber of Commerce welcomed Honourable Scott Moe. Minister of Environment to Yorkton Aug 22. Honourable Greg Ottenbreit, Minister Responsible for Rural & Remote Health was also in attendance. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss with the Chamber the federal tax on carbon and its impact on industry and business in the province. The Chamber reiterated that it is opposed to the carbon tax - as are the other Chambers of Commerce in Saskatchewan.

The Government of Saskatchewan (GOS) believes that in order to reduce green house gases (GHG) in the atmosphere, the conversation and focus needs to be centred around how to lower emissions as opposed to taxing what is emitted. Messers Moe and Ottenbreit indicated that taxation does not reduce emissions.

Mr. Moe then shared how the GOS has been meeting with those businesses, especially the trade-exposed, carbonintensive industries such as the energy, mining and agriculture

sectors to discuss with them the work each sector is doing to reduce its carbon emissions.

He encourages businesses to document, in relation to emissions, "what they have done, what they are currently doing and what they can do in the future" and to let the Ministry know this. Mr. Moe indicated that "Saskatchewan's suite of environmental regulations" under which industry is expected to operate in the province is "the best in the world". He added that Saskatchewan is currently one of the best places in the world in which to do business and the GOS does not want to give that up.

- That the Yorkton Brick Mill was built circa 1899 - 1900 by the owner of the brick plant that was also located in Yorkton
- That in 1947, in celebration of the marriage of Princess Elizabeth to Phillip Mountbatten, the City of Yorkton shipped a railcar of flour milled at the Mill to Great Britain to help alleviate post-war food shortages.
- On January 1, 1884, Yorkton received its current name (formerly York City) and the first post office was opened
