

Chamber & Council Meet



The introduction of the proposed 2018 Budget prompted the Chamber Board of Directors to request a meeting with City Council. The meeting occurred Thursday February 15 with 5 Councillors present. Mayor Maloney sent his regrets as he was called to a meeting between SUMA and the provincial government.

The Chamber proposed the following talking points:

- a brief synopsis of the SUMA convention which occurred in early February
- Council's contingency plans following the delivery of the Federal and Provincial budgets
- the effect a further reduction in the Grants-In-Lieu (franchise fee) will have on the city coffers
- the effect the legalization of cannabis will have on the city's policing budget

- the city's plans to assist existing businesses to grow; to attract new businesses; and to attract sporting and cultural events to the city.
- the Chamber's submission to Council comprised of comments received from members with regards to the Budget

As a result of the meeting, the Chamber is working on setting up a meeting with the Minister of Government Relations and Hon. Greg Ottenbreit, Yorkton MLA to discuss the importance of Grants-In-Lieu (franchise fee) for power generation in the city. The Chamber is also concerned about the potential added cost to city policing once marijuana is legalized. The Chamber will also set up a meeting with the City's Ec Dev committee to discuss the need to create an environment that encourages the growth of existing businesses and one that attracts new business to the city. Attracting sporting and cultural events to the city is another opportunity the Chamber wants to see explored more fully.

The Board appreciates the opportunity to discuss with Council the issues and opportunities facing Yorkton. It's through consultation and collaboration that strategies can be developed to keep Yorkton a place "where good things happen"!

Are You Complaining?

With the introduction of the 2018 City Budget at the January 29 Council Meeting, Council invited residents to submit to them their comments and concerns about the budget and proposed tax increases. Council even provided a Feedback Form that could be used. The Chamber, through email blasts, radio announcements and social media, also encouraged its members to provide feedback to Council. Council received 7 phone calls; the Chamber received 2 written submissions.

The Chamber's Board of Directors does not like the increase in property taxes, knowing it hurts everyone's wallet. But how does the City continue to provide services if it doesn't raise taxes? If you were hoping for no increase in property taxes in 2018, what services are you willing to see cut? Which roads and sidewalks do not get patched or fixed?

City Council is elected to make tough decisions about the budget. But it asked for feedback. It's too late now to complain about the Budget that was presented Jan 29 as that budget was passed February 20. So what to do now?
