In the Saskatchewan Government's document What to Know About Cannabis Legalization in Saskatchewan, a section deals with the Workplace:

- Under Saskatchewan law, employers and workers must ensure the health, safety and welfare of other workers. Drug or alcohol impairment violates this basic requirement.
- Medical cannabis has been available for nearly two decades and must be authorized by a medical professional such as a doctor. Employers will

continue to accommodate workers with an authorization from a doctor. Workers cannot decide for themselves that cannabis helps them deal with a health condition.

- Employees involved in high?hazard work (such as driving or operating heavy machinery) have a general duty to advise their employer if they've been taking a medication with side effects that include impairment.

  - With the legalization of cannabis occurring across Canada, the Government of Saskatchewan is ensuring everyone is clear on what the new rules are.

# New Agreement Signed to Support Infrastructure Projects

October 3, 2018 proved to be a very good day for the Province of Saskatchewan!It was then that the Federal and Provincial governments signed the bilateral agreement that will provide more than \$896 million in federal funding over the next decade for infrastructure projects. These projects will be cost-shared with the Saskatchewan government, municipalities and other partners.

Mayor Bob Maloney, as SUMA's Vice President of Cities, was

present to witness the signing. He indicated SUMA has been lobbying for a Saskatchewan deal for several years. "It's good to see the federal money flowing to the province", he said. "I'm excited about the potential for Yorkton". He is confident that some of these funds will soon make their way into the coffers of small cities, towns and rural municipalities.



It's expected that federal dollars will come to Yorkton to assist with the construction of infrastructure projects.
