

Carbon Survey Says

December 2018, Yorkton Chamber members were invited to participate in a Sask Chamber survey about carbon pricing.

As per the results of a similar survey in 2016, Chamber members do not view a carbon tax as appropriate for Saskatchewan.

Approximately 87% of respondents stated overwhelmingly that a carbon tax would increase their operating costs. If a carbon tax is imposed, respondents also anticipate a reduction in staff and decreased sales.

In one-on-one consultations with a number of businesses, many believe that any revenue generated by a tax on carbon must be fully directed back to processes that reduce carbon emissions.

Several respondent comments

mentioned that Saskatchewan has carbon sequestration assets (zerotill agricultural practices, boreal forests in the North, native prairie grasslands, CCS at Boundary Dam 3, diesel exhaust burners and H2S gas scrubbers for transport trucks, etc.) for which it does not receive adequate credit.



Opportunities for Employers through the Canada-Saskatchewan Job Grant Program

The Canada-Saskatchewan Job Grant provides employers with funding to train new or existing employees to meet the skill requirements for available jobs.

The Canada-Saskatchewan Job Grant is open to private sector and non-profits in Saskatchewan. The grant not only helps organizations train employees, but it also provides opportunities for workers to improve their skills, and help them reach their career path goals.

Through the program, the employer contributes one-third

of the training cost, while the federal and provincial governments contribute the remaining two-thirds. Employers may make multiple grant applications of up to \$10,000 per employee, to a maximum of \$100,000 per fiscal year. Examples of the training costs that are eligible for this grant include: tuition and mandatory student fees, textbooks, software and other required materials, and exam fees.

Training must be provided by an eligible third-party training institution and must be



completed within one calendar year from the start date. Training must be approved by the Ministry of Immigration and Career Training prior to taking place in order to qualify for funding.

Who Gets the Business?



Panelists Jason Heinmiller, BakerTilly SK LLP; Wanda Hunchak, Westcap Management; Brooks Mack, Brooks Mack Law; and Lee Schultz, BDC Regina answered a number of questions related to Business Succession at last evening's Business Succession Information Session sponsored by Community Futures Ventures & the Chamber. Each panelist
