# Chamber and YBID . . . Their Role in the Community

While "out and about" this winter visiting with Yorkton Chamber members, the Chamber staff were asked a few times, "what's the difference between the Chamber and YBID?" Good question.

These are the differences from the Chamber's point of view:

#### **Yorkton Chamber of Commerce**

- The "voice of business in Yorkton"
- Primary role is to advocate for its members and the business community
- Secondary role is to provide educational & networking opportunities for its members
- Voluntary membership
- Open to all
  - Members outside city limits
- Directors are elected by the membership
- · Not a commission of the City
- No government funding (municipal/provincial/federal)
- Funded by membership fees, events, affinity programs, etc
- 122 years old!

#### YBID

#### (Yorkton Business Improvement District)

- Serves its members in a defined geographic area
- Non-voluntary membership
- Goal is "to assist local businesses and property owners in revitalizing and promoting their business in a redesigned shopping environment"
- Levy against each property owner in the District (generates ~\$100K/y); PLUS matching grant from City (~\$100K/y)
- Directors are appointed by the Mayor

While there are differences between the mandates of the two organizations, the Chamber and YBID often work together for the betterment of the business community and the community at large. In fact, many Chamber member businesses are located within YBID's boundaries.

So if your business, located anywhere in Yorkton, has concerns or issues, contact the Chamber. If you have ideas about how to make the YBID zone more attractive to customers/clients or other businesses, contact YBID.



President Mike Stackhouse and Director Mark Hoddenbagh attended the Sask Chamber's Political Forum in late January.

#### **Chamber In Action**

Just 2 months into the new year and already there have been issues to advocate on behalf of the Yorkton Chamber members. The Chamber has sent letters to the following:

 Premier Scott Moe commending his government for switching the conversation with the Federal Government from the carbon tax to the environment and the many ways Saskatchewanians endeavour to reduce their carbon footprint.

However, the Chamber urged his government to continue to pressure the Federal Government to remove the carbon tax on the fuel used for drying grain.

 Cathay Wagantall, MP requesting that she and other members of the Opposition urge the Government to work with the provinces and law enforcement agencies to bring an end to the ongoing disruptions of public services created by blockades occurring across Canada; and in particular, to restore all rail services immediately.

As mentioned previously, the Chamber was represented at the Sask Chamber's Political Forum in Regina where the Directors were able to pose questions to the Opposition and then to Government.

These included questions about the Urban Connector Program which would repair York Road as it links Hwy #16 and Hwy #9; and ideas to support training and stimulate innovation and entrepreneurship in rural, remote and northern SK by using existing resources such as regional colleges.
