SAMA Survey Important for Commercial Real Estate Rental Market

Your property data helps create the assessment model for the next revaluation in 2029. Commercial property owners should have received a questionnaire from the Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency (SAMA) related to your 2025 real estate Lease Income. The information collected relates to the REAL ESTATE and NOT THE BUSINESS income and expenses.

SAMA requests the same information fee appraisers use in their commercial appraisals. At this time, only property owners with leasable space are surveyed. Properties that are 100% owner occupied will not receive a questionnaire.

The Chamber stresses the importance of completing this questionnaire as the data collected will be used to create your

assessment in 2029. Complying with SAMA's request will ensure that the assessments can be reflective of the data you provide and reflective of the market conditions for properties in the local market.
