## Talking Points Available

As the provincial and municipal elections approach, the Chamber reminds the businesses that in July it released 2 documents – Talking Points for the Provincial Election and Talking Points for the Municipal Election. At the Media Conference where the documents were released, Chair of the Chamber's Policy Committee, Mike Stackhouse said, "The Chamber identified areas of interest to the business community and has made recommendations in each of those area. The Chamber wants people to talk about the recommendations and to discuss these with the respective candidates for either the constituency of Yorkton or for Mayor and Council."

The 5 areas of interest in the provincial Talking Points document include: Taxes & Red Tape; Education; Infrastructure; Workforce; and Business Development.

The 4 areas of interest in the municipal Talking Points document include: Property Taxes; City Budgets; Business Development; and Infrastructure.

Chamber President Sunil Shah indicated the Chamber has a responsibility to provide information and leadership on key business issues. "It is important that both orders of government ensure their policies and legislation assist businesses to establish and grow," said Shah. "Working on the premise that "when the business community is strong, the entire community is strong", the Chamber is confident these recommendations will ensure Yorkton will continue to thrive".

The municipal document also contains information about the nomination process to run for Mayor or Council and the time commitment involved in serving on Council. The Talking Points documents are available from the Chamber office; the Chamber website www.yorktonchamber.com; and from Pumphouse Athletic Club and Source Embroidery.

The Provincial Election is expected October 28 while the Municipal Election is set for November 13. Stackhouse said the Chamber encourages the citizens of Yorkton to vote in both of these very important elections.



The Chamber's Talking Points documents for both the upcoming provincial and municipal elections were released at a Media Conference in late July. President Sunil Shah indicated the Chamber is confident the recommendations contained therein will ensure Yorkton continues to thrive.

# Did You Know?

- In 2009, the City of Yorkton was the first Saskatchewan municipality to develop a Municipal Cultural Plan, which was a pilot project completed with SaskCulture. The City recently released an updated **Community Cultural Plan**. It can be found on the city's website www.yorkton. ca One of the recommendations of the Plan is to strike an Advisory Committee to oversee the implementation of the Plan. - On July 11, 1894 Yorkton was incorporated as a village. Yorkton received its City Charter Feb1, 1928 (from Our Towns by David McLennan)
- Saskatchewan seeds more that half of Canada's field pea acres annually. Louis Dreyfus Company (LDC) representatives indicated that Yorkton is an ideal location for its new pea protein isolate plant as the Yorkton area already has a number of growers and the advantage of having 2 railways and 4 highways passing through it. Pea protein can be used in such products as meat alternatives, sports and nutrition drinks and in dairy products



Once completed in late 2025, LDC's pea protein isolate plant will add another 60 iobs.

It means becoming more self-sufficient and less dependent on imports. Control moves from the boardrooms of distant corporations and back into the community where it belongs." – Michael H.
