### **STEP Meets in Yorkton**



At the meeting between the Chamber and STEP, Chamber Directors met with CEO Chris Dekker (Far right) and Marlin Strangeland, Chair (2nd from right). Mike Popowich of TA Foods (2nd from left) is a member of the STEP Board.

Recently the Board of Directors of the Saskatchewan Trade & Export Partnership (STEP) gathered in Yorkton for a Board meeting. STEP is in the "export risk reduction business". It provides to its members market intelligence; export education; and trade development including 40 - 45 national and international missions per year.

CEO Chris Dekker indicated that STEP estimates 1 in 3 jobs in Saskatchewan are reliant on exports. In 2023, Saskatchewan had over \$49B in export sales. Saskatchewan is, based on exports per capita, the #1 exporter in Canada. Our top 4 exports include oil, potash, wheat and canola oil.

The Chamber Board of Directors and Chamber members in the export business were pleased to meet with STEP's Directors and to learn more about STEP and the role it plays in assisting our exporters access markets.



### Chamber Meets with APAS



Recently, members of the Chamber's Policy committee met with Agriculture Producers Association of Saskatchewan (APAS) including Bill Prybylski, Vice President (3rd from left) and Curtis Hemming, Assistant Executive Director (3rd from right). The Yorkton Chamber recognizes the contributions to the business community made by our farming and ranching neighbours. As a result, the Yorkton Chamber has been very interested in government policies affecting farms and ranches. In particular, the

effect the carbon tax has on these entities. In turn, Mr. Prybylski said it's important that the businesses in Yorkton do well so the farms and ranches can purchase equipment, supplies and repairs close-to-home. During the course of the meeting, APAS shared their "Farmers & Food Prices 2023" document that is a comprehensive study examining eight distinct retail products derived from Saskatchewan farm commodities (beef, pork, beer, canola oil, margarine, lentils, flour and bread). The objective was to determine the share of grocery store prices attributed to these farm commodities and explore their connection to food price inflation. This easy-toread document can be found at https://apas.ca/ pub/2023%20PDF's/farmers-and-food-pricesreport-final.pdf Bottom line? Farmers are NOT the reason for food price inflation.
